Ordinance No. 13  
Fiscal Year 2004 Series**

**An Ordinance Relating to Speed Limits on County Roads**

Whereas, the Fiscal Court of Spencer County, Kentucky has determined it necessary to re-evaluate speed limits on county maintained roads,

Now Therefore, Be It Ordained by the Fiscal Court of Spencer County, Kentucky that:

Section One. Establishment of Speed Limits. A speed limit of 25 miles-per-hour be and the same is hereby set for county maintained roads within the confines of a subdivision\*. A speed limit of 35 miles-per-hour be and the same is hereby set for all county maintained roads outside the confines of a subdivision\*, unless otherwise previously ordained and posted.

Section Two. Signage. Speed limit signs shall be posted upon public request and this speed limit shall still apply regardless of signs being posted.

Section Three. Severability. Provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any provision is found to be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance.

Section Four. Ordinances Repealed. Ordinances 6 and 7 (2000 Series) establishing speed limits are hereby repealed.


Section Five. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective and in full force upon passage and publication according to law.


\*The term "Subdivision" is defined in the Taylorsville-Spencer County, Kentucky Joint Planning & Zoning Revised Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations (Revised May 1992) as "a division of a tract of parcel of land into three (3) or more parcels for the purpose, whether immediate or future, of sale or of building development provided, however, that a division of land for agricultural purposes into parcels of five (5) acres or more and which does not involve a new street shall not be deemed a subdivision. The term subdivision shall refer to the land subdivided or to the process of subdividing according to the context."
